From The Manse...

Dear Friends,

The three things that seem most important to a Church that is declining are offerings, numbers and buildings. Isn't it funny that in the years of greatest growth of the Church none of these are mentioned? The early Church grew at a phenomenal rate and what seemed most important was that the members showed love to one another and to the outsider, even to their enemy.

I have the privilege of ministering a few times per year to the believers at Kilberry Church, 10

miles on a single-track road from Tarbert, Loch Fyne. I love going there. There is no organist, no sound system, not even a toilet! (That is a special challenge!) The members on a rota, all eight of them, bring flasks of coffee and tea and some home baking, which they serve at the close of worship. The service itself is led by my bad singing and strained voice. There are no cushions on the pews, but they all listen intently to the preaching of the word. There is such a good atmosphere, created by the Spirit



Himself.

The fellowship afterwards is very, very warm. Even though I see the folks so infrequently I feel wrapped in their love. They are a Church that attracts, yes just ones and twos, and each time I go someone is missing, usually due to age or infirmity, but there is always someone new, a new resident or residents to the sparsely populated area. They find, no matter their background, and some are very wealthy English folk who have a yacht and have escaped the rat race and are never used to such a style of service, that in Kilberry Church the love of God is found and they want to be there. Fullarton is full of love. I have never been kissed or hugged so much in any Church, which as an East Coaster I sometimes struggle with! We came to Fullarton after I retired simply because we felt welcomed as friends and we have never left! If we keep loving one another as Jesus Himself encourages us then we will be functioning as a true Church and the Lord will add to our number those who are being saved, to quote Acts. Neil and Dorothy I am sure are looking forward to being back with you again and being

wrapped in your love. Above all, love one another, for the greatest of these (whatever it is in the Church) is love.

From Probationer Minister

What were you doing 10 years ago? In the last few months, we've especially enjoyed being part of the Alpha course, getting to know and love many more of you, and it was extra special to be able to celebrate the resurrection of King Jesus with you all at Easter.

It's that resurrection of Jesus at Easter that gives us hope. Hope for today, tomorrow, and all the days ahead. It gives us hope in the darkest of days, when illness, poverty, temptations, despair and death come knocking at our doors. And, ultimately, that resurrection gives us hope that God so loves us that our sins are forgiven, and that we are made new in Christ!

The Bible declares over and over again, that Jesus, his death on the cross, and his resurrection from the tomb are our only hope. Peter declares, "There is salvation in no

one else! God has given no other name under heaven by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:12) For the past 10 years (and more) I've loved being able to declare the wonderful good news that Jesus is alive, and that he's come to save people from their sins - people like you and me! I'm so thankful for the opportunities I have to share that good news, and I pray that even as we move past this Easter season, we'll continue to be people living with resurrection hope stirring in our souls!

If there's anything Kirsty and I can do for you, or pray for, let us know. We'd love to pray for you. I'm also very happy to visit people or meet up for a coffee and chat about things - I'm only a call or email away if you need me.

May is our last Messy Church session before we break for summer. It has been an exciting first few months and so we wanted to share a bit about Messy Church.

The first messy church started in Portsmouth in 2004 as a way to try to build community and reach out to unchurched families.

The overarching aim of Messy church is simply to introduce families to Jesus, allowing an opportunity to encounter Jesus and hopefully to grow closer to him. It is based on 3 principles. These are creativity, celebration and hospitality. Through these we hope to provide families with an experience of church, worship, prayer and also fellowship. In Fullarton we have been having on average 25 families attending on the last Friday of the month. This equates to approximately 60 people each month. We start with a welcome time

and tea/coffee. Then we have a short story and introduction to our theme. We have a prayer and then at least 4 different activities to help build up the theme we are covering each month. Following about 40 mins on the activities we then reconvene for a family meal. It is a chaotic, crazy way to spend 2 hours of your month!! So far we have heard about Jesus story of the Prodigal Son, we have thought about our families and how God wants us to be part of that kind of community. On Good Friday we thought about new life in Jesus and April looks at Jesus as our Healer.

It has been lovely to see so many families coming along. We hope and pray that this continues. There is so much research showing that families are much less impacted by adversity when they have support in their local communities. We hope

that this is a positive step in reaching out to new families and supporting them.

ConneXions Report – May 2018

Jeff Bridges said, 'The way to change the world is through individual responsibility and taking local action in your own community.' One of the things ConneXions does really well is building community. This is a community that seeks to serve one another with love and compassion and exists to extend that love and compassion to the wider community of Fullarton and Harbourside. Over the last few months, as things have grown steadily and rapidly, we have seen a greater number of people from all across the local community coming into the ConneXions building, for a wide variety of reasons. Sometimes it is easy to get bogged down in efficiency, management, strategy, administration and organisation, and when there is a lot happening in a busy place, this natural tendency only becomes greater.

However, it is really important for us Coordinators to keep in mind, and reiterate regularly to our volunteers and stakeholders, that what we are building here, whilst being a professional enterprise, is essentially a community, and as such the most important element of what we do is the people we encounter on a daily basis. Building community is a messy business and does not happen overnight, but we are always encouraged by steps forward and seeing people grow.

Jesus spent much of his time investing in people, teaching them the values of God's Kingdom and how to live a fulfilled and impactful life that inspires people, transforms societies and brings healing to a battered a broken world. At ConneXions we aspire to be a living example of God's love and build the kind of community that has Jesus' Kingdom values at it's very

core. This means taking risks on people and ideas, being innovative and unafraid to make changes, face confrontation and make brave decisions.

One of the best ways of investing in people and helping them grow as individuals who make a difference to their community, is by providing opportunities to volunteer. Everyone has a specific gift, talent or passion, that is sometimes latent and hidden and just needs some coaxing out. Some people have lived with this latency, hiding their light under a bushel for fear of putting themselves out there and the possibility of failure, for so long that it feels normal to them.

Imagine a community in which everyone is working to their potential and using their gifts and talents confidently for the benefit of everyone else, without fear of failure or rejection. Fear is debilitating and prevents us from achieving all that God has made possible for us; building the kind of community I have just

described, in which everyone receives mutual benefit.

We have been hearing about failure in our Sunday services at Fullarton Parish Church lately and failure is a natural consequence of making progress and trying new things. We would not have grown in the way we have, and had such an impact on the local community, were it not for the failures of people along the way, which served to teach and encourage. As the saying goes, 'the only real failure is the failure to try.' I know what it is like to feel disempowered; when you have tried and strive for so long, in so many ways and feel utterly discouraged, as though there is no hope of ever achieving what you set out to achieve, but the difference between people who change the world and people who don't is that they keep going when failure strikes. Failure is inevitable, it will come. But we must not fear it.

Maybe you would love to volunteer some time at ConneXions to help serve the community, but perhaps you

feel as though your talents are not in the right area, or have grown so disillusioned that you are not even sure that you are talented or where your skills lie. We would love to talk to you, encourage you and help you find a place where you belong, where you bring something unique to the table and where you can find enjoyment and fulfilment of your potential.

It may be that you have not considered volunteering, but that you can think of ways that you could be useful, help others and become part of the growth you see happening around you. In that case, we'd love to speak with you also. There are dozens of areas, both small and large, where we could really do with some extra help from individuals and from those working as part of a team. Please feel free to come and chat with one of us about volunteering opportunities and how you can become part of this movement.

As we are now running at capacity, and managing growth, there will be lots of

room for improvement in the services we run and new ideas and creative solutions that we will be implementing to help ConneXions continue to be the force for good that it currently is. This will involve a fair amount of risk taking, and will therefore be fuelled by the encouragement and support of the people around us in our community who volunteer their time and efforts freely.

Buy a reusable cup and take it everywhere


Hopefully by the year 2025 a lot of plastic will be eradi-


